WEST GERMANY DECIDES TO KEEP NAZI WAR CRIMINALS ON THE RUN

NO OIL THREAT FROM SAUDIS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, who visited Jordan and Saudi Arabia, said that the Saudis did not mention to him their reported "threat" to link oil supplies with the Israeli-Egyptian talks on autonomy for the West Bank and Gaza Strip. "The two issues of energy and the issue of the problems here should be dealt with as separate problems. I would have thought that Saudia Arabia would understand that its own position depends on a stable world." Kissinger also said that he did not believe that King Hussein of Jordan was bent on a military confrontation with Israel.

Kissinger was in Israel earlier to receive an honorary degree from Hebrew University July 1. He said at the time that Israel and the U.S. must reach an understanding on the meaning of autonomy for the West Bank and the Gaza strip in order to make any progress in the current negotiations. He said he was amazed by the changes in the Mideast since he conducted his famous "shuttle diplomacy" in 1975. "Even more important than the terms of what has been achieved is this growing confidence that has developed between at least one Arab nation and the State of Israel," he said.

BONN (WNS) -- The Bundestag, the lower house of the West German Parliament, voted in early July to eliminate the statute of limitations on prosecuting Nazi war criminals. The vote after a 10 - hour debate was 255-222. The measure has still to be approved by the Bundesrat, the upper house, but this is considered a formality.

Had the statute not been abolished, it would have gone into effect January 1, 1980, making Nazi war criminals not yet subject to the legal process forever immune from prosecution.

Bundestag deputies were permitted to vote their conscience on the measure rather than along party lines.

Chancellor Helmut Schmidt and his governing Social Democrats (SPD) wanted the statute abolished where the opposition Christian Democrats (CDU) wanted to keep it.

Justice Minister Hans - Jochen Vogel, urging the statute be eliminated, said at the start of the debate that the Federal Republic has to make its position clear in view of the million of Nazi victims. "Every murder detected after December 31 who could no longer be prosecuted would be a severe blow to peace based on justice and to Germany's image," he declared.

Israeli and world Jewish leaders, who had been urging West Germany to abolish the statute of limitations, praised the vote and congratulated the German government. Israeli Justice Minister Shmuel Tamir interrupted a recent Knesset session to announce the Bundestag vote. He said he hoped now Nazi criminals still free would be brought to trial.

This same hope was voiced by Premier Menachem Begin to visiting West Berlin Mayor Dietrick Stobbe. Begin also expressed his satisfaction with the German action. Labor Party chairman Shimon Peres sent a cable of

AIR STRIKES STOP

TERRORIST ACTS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel's air strikes against terrorist tar-

gets in south Lebanon has aborted at least 80 percent of planned terrorist attacks against Israel in recent weeks, Gen. Yehoshua Saguy, chief of Military Intelligence, said.

He noted that Syrian jets had attacked Israeli planes in the first such encounter since 1973, even though the Israeli jets were hitting terrorist targets 10 kilometers south of where the Syrian troops in Lebanon were deployed.

Saguy said that if Syrians do not seek another encounter there will be none. He claimed Israel has no confirmation of reports that the Syrians have brought SAM 6 anti - aircraft missiles into Lebanon.
