KIAMESHA LAKE, N.Y. (WNS) -- Presi-dent Carter has stressed that "as long as a comprehensive settlement in the Middle East eludes us, as long as, simple justice is denied to one individual anywhere on the face of this world, the rest of us enjoy an uneasy peace and uneasy justice." Saul Davis, Brith Abraham grand master, before reading the President's message announced that the order has merged with Bnai Zion recently to work together on programs designed to help Israel, Soviet Jewry, Jewish Education, combat anti - Semitism, support worthy charities, etc. The affiliation will bring together two of the oldest fraternal orders in the country - the 92 - year - old Brith Abraham and the 71 - year - old Bnai Zion.

LONDON (WNS) -- Greville Janner, a Labor MP, has been elected president of the Board of Deputies of British Jews after serving six years as its senior vice - president. At 51 he is the youngest president in the Board's 219year history. He is the son of Lord Janner, a former Board president. Declaring himself a staunch Zionist, Janner pledged to strive for better relations between the Israeli and British governments.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Israel said it will have nothing to do with a Security Council debate on a report by the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian people. Israeli Ambassador Yehuda Blum said the debate is taking place because the ene-mies of peace in the Middle East want "to subvert the ongoing peace process." The committee which was established by the General Assembly in November 1976, has 23 members, 19 from countries which do not have diplomatic relations with Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Yigal Allon, who served as Foreign Minister in the last two Labor governments and derives his political support from the Labor - oriented kibbutz movement, has indicated he may challenge Shimon Peres for the chairmanship of the Labor Party at the next party convention. So far only Peres and former Premier Yitzhak Rabin have been mentioned as candidates for the post, although Rabin has given no indication he would seek the chairmanship.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Jamie Lokman, an Argentine Jew arrested in Cordoba on the day of the March, 1976 coup which brought the present military junta into power, has been transferred to the harsh Rawson prison in south Argentina according to, Rabbi Morton Rosenthal, director of the Latin American Affairs department of the Anti - Defamation League of B'nai B'rith. Rosenthal said Lokman, an automobile dealer who was the first of 1000 Jews arrested by the military, remains imprisoned without formal charges filed against him.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The National Conference on Soviet Jewry reports that the Ukrainian Supreme Court has affirmed the death sentences of four Jews convicted last August of "economic crimes" in Donestak. Fifty codefendants in the year - long closed trial, all non - Jews, received lesser sentences. The four sentenced to death are: Gavriel Sepiashvili, 39, of Sukhumi; Raphael Abziashvili, 48, and Elia Mikhashvilli, 42, both from Tblisi, and a Baku man surnamed Abassov.


