Resolution 446, adopted on 22 March 1979 and which was rejected in its entirety of Israel "affirms that the Fourth Geneva Convention relative to the protection of civilian persons is applicable to the Arab territories occupied by Israel since 1967" and "determines that the policy and practices of Israel in establishing settlements...have no legal validity..." It also called upon Israel "to rescind all measures that resulted in changing the legal status and geographical nature . . . of the Arab territories, including Jerusalem ...

"Even the most cursory reading of the Commission's Report and its conclusions shows that Israel's reservations were more than justified," Yehuda Blum told the Council, "What is particularly disconcerning is the fact that the tone and technique of the report are sadly reminiscent of those employed in the reports of the 'Palestine Committee,' which is little more than a pliant tool in the hands of the terrorist PLO, a criminal organization bent on indiscriminate terror against a member - State of the UN and on the mass murder of its citizens.'

The Jordanian Ambassador, who had initiated this debate against Israel last March as a maneuver in an attempt to offset the successes of the Camp David accords, had the hutzpah to tell the Council in his diatribe that "the Wailing Wall and the pavement in front of it belonged to the Arabs."

NEW YORK (WUP) -- Noting that despite differences some among American Jews affecting on issues Israel, the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations has found that there is a powerful consensus on the major issues that must determine the nature of peace.

At the latest meeting of the Conference, composed of some bodies, 32 national following five principles were unanimously adopted:

1. Israel's settlements on the West ·Bank are legal, Jimmy Carter to contrary.

2. There must be no 'Palestinian state' on the West Bank. Such a state would be a dagger pointed at the heart of Israel.

3. There must be no dealing with the PLO, the terrorist that seeks to destroy the Jewish State. Here is Yasir Arafat, quoted by the AP (Beirut, May quoted by 8, 1979): "I am confident that we shall. overrun eventually Begin's own offices in both Jerusalem and Tel Aviv....even if only one guerrilla survives the prolong-ed struggle."

4. Jerusalem indivisible. As the spiritual capital of the Jewish people, it must remain the political capital of united Israel, a Israeli city under sovereignty.

WASH. (WNS) -- The State Department has recommended President Carter that spokesman Hodding

Saudi Arabia be sold \$1,2 billion in weapons to equip four new battalions of its national guard.

The recommendation, which has to be approved by Congress, came a week after it was announced that Saudi Arabia was increasing its daily oil production to help offset the gas shortage in the U.S.

Sen. Henry Jackson (D. Wash.) said he "wondered out loud" whether "conditions" were connected to the But State Department ISRAELITE ADS

Carter denied any linkage between the arms sale and the increased production. "the sales arms to Saudi Arabia are conducted without any deals or links to Saudia Arabian oil," he said.

He said the sale is in the "context" of Saudi Arabian"security" and the "sta-bility" of the Middle East. Carter also said the sale of arms is "not in any way offered" in terms of Mideast policy.
