## Carter's Blindness

Former Secretary of State Henry A, Kissinger, in testifying recently on the SALT II treaty, noted that one of the disadvantages that the United States has in negotiating with the Soviet Union is that Americans always believe that if the other side does not agree with your position you change it in order to find a compromise position. The Soviets, however, Kissinger said, are not embarrassed by repeating the same position year after year. He said the Soviets are willing to wait for the U.S. to lose patience and agree to their demands.

A similar development can be seen in the U.S. dealings with the Arab countries. The Carter Administration appears tired of trying to convince the Arab countries of joining the Israeli - Egyptian peace efforts and seems to be on the verge of agreeing to demands by the Palestine Liberation Organization that United Nations Security Council Resolution 242 be amended to include something about Palestinian selfdetermination.

The Carter Administration, and for that matter, the Nixon and Ford Administrations under which Kissinger directed foreign policy, has always been more prone to meet Arab demands than worry about Israeli sensibilities. Never mind that Resolution 242 is the basis for all peace efforts in the Middle East, a position that the U.S. has supported. Never mind that even the talk of amending the efforts is all that is needed to increase Israeli fears of a U.S. sellout of their interests.

The Carter Administration has, since coming to office, demonstrated occasional blindness to Israeli sensibilities which have harmed even the Administration's constructive efforts in the Mideast. This was demonstrated at the Security Council where the U.S. appears to be ready to go along with a change in 242 but also in the proposal to use the United Nations Truce Supervisory Organization (UNTSO) in the Sinai in place of the UN Emergency Force (UNEF), despite Israel's strong objections.

This lack of sensitivity was also demonstrated by Carter's unbelievable statement comparing the Palestinian issue with the civil rights movement in the U.S. This statement not only angered Jews, but also Blacks, who took umbrage that a peaceful drive for legitimate rights could be equated with a movement that is based on terrorism.

Unless the Administration stands fast on 242 and stops its practice of making off-thecuff statements that can only serve to add to Israel's concern it will destroy all the good work it has done in the Mideast.

order to give Washington more time to consider a new resolution favorable to the Arabs and Soviets and one which would supplement resolution 242 -- it now becomes clear that Ambassador Young's recent reference to the PLO spokesman as "being moderate and decent human beings" might not have been one of his oftmade slips of the tongue but in actuality a true reflection of the views held by the State Department and The White House,

Indeed, the events of the past few weeks -the U.S. - USSR deal on the non-extension of UNEF appeasing the radical Arabs, the Washington - Saudi connection on oil, Carter's statement equating the Palestinian issue with the civil. rights movement, and his Administration's softening position vis - a - vis the PLO -border on 'betrayal,' on a renege on pledges, and gives one the impression that America has succumbed to blackmail, that Washington has renounced principle for expediency.

Touching upon the Saudi connection, Times correspondent Hedrick Smith reports from the capital that "the White House and State Department insisted that President Carter made no promises to Saudi Arabia in return for its decision in early July to ease the world shortage of oil by increasing Saudi Arabian oil production by one million barrels a day for three to six months." (Note the time limit!)

"But," Smith adds, "American policy makers note that Saudis operate according to the Bedouin code that a favor by one party begets a return Their implication is that the Saudis could decide to cut production in the fall if they were dissatisfied by a lack of negotiating progress on the Palestinian issue."

Surely, Carter and his aides must be fully aware of the fact that the postponed Security Council debate on the "Inalienable Rights of the Palestinians," which adjourned to a later. date this month, had been exploited by the enemies of Israel who introduced a document containing some "Basic Considerations and Guidelines" that called for, among other things, "the participation of the PLO....on an equal footing with other parties." But, worse of all, to the shame of all those aspiring to give legitimacy to Yasir Arafat's slayers of inno-cents, this same "Guidelines" document, in effect, called for the destruction of the Jewish State in two phases, namely:

"Phase one involves the return to their homes of the Palestinians displaced as a result of the war of June 1967, and phase two deals with the return to their homes of the Palestinians displaced between 1948 and 1967."

This is the scheme of the 'tyranny of the majority' in this one-sided Organization and America and other Western states appear to go along.
