
RETURN OF OIL FIELDS meets Egyptian Presi-

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Energy Minister Yitzhak Modai warned that Israel may have to delay the return of the Alma oilfields in Sinai to Egypt until an agreement is reached between the two countries on how much oil and for what price Egypt will sell it to Israel. Modai made his statement after returning from

Egypt. he said the gap between Israel and Egypt on the amount and price of oil is still very wide.

He expressed hope that the issue will be settled when Premier Menachem Begin dent Anwar Sadat in Haifa. Israel wants Egypt to sell it two million of tons annually, about the same amount Israel now pumps from the

oil wells. But, Mosai said the Egyptians only agree to sell Israel 1.5 million tons. Israel would be required to participate in international bidding for the additional oil.
