We consider ourselves privileged to have been selected to fulfill our traditional mandate to be our brother's keepers and to extend the hand of Tzedakah to Jewish communities overseas wherever they may be; nearby in Latin America, across the ocean in Europe, in Israel, or in the far corners of the earth.

In their name we greet the American Jewish community which makes our work possible through their unstinting efforts and generosity to the United Jewish Appeal which provides most of the JDC funds. And in the name of the American Jewish community we greet the hundreds of thousands of Jews in 25 countries overseas who

are beneficiaries of our programs and services.

May all be inscribed for a healthy, happy, prosperous and peaceful New Year.

tribute to the Jewish people's constant quest for peace. To emphasize this point, he invited Jewish leaders from various countries to accompany him to Oslo when he received the Prize.

On a practical plane, the peace treaty has already put Egypt firmly on the Jewish tourist map. Thousands of Jews who had been looking for some new place to visit were delighted to find Egypt now open before them and are to be found at Luxor and the Pyramids. A few have even been received by Sadat. This development has proved an unexpected boost for the tiny Jewish communities of Cairo and Alexandria. Once a great historic Jewry, there are now only about 300 Jews in Egypt, and they find it hard to grasp that they are no longer isolated.

Not all aspects of the peace negotiations have been smooth going for world Jewry. In particular, the Israel Government's settlement policy in the administered territories caused a certain perplexity and controversy. However, Jews everywhere have stood solidly behind the peace process and celebrated every manifestation of progress.

The other great event of the past year was

the release from Soviet imprisonment and from Russia of several key Jewish activists who had been convicted in 1970 of trying to hijack an airplane in Leningrad to escape from the USSR.

In another gesture, the Russians stepped up the number of the emigration permits issued to Jews to an annual average of 50,000.

Jews everywhere joined Israelis in mourning the death of Golda Meir. She had become one of the best - loved Jewish personalities, not only as an Israeli leader but by virtue of her innate Jewish wisdom and warmth, commonsense and courage, which universally endeared her and made her into a symbol of the contemporary Jewish - Israeli symbiosis.

The award of the Nobel Literature Prize to Isaac Bashevis Singer was an international recognition for Yiddish literature - a welcome fillip at a time when the number of Yiddish speakers and readers in the world is diminishing. And the fact that more than half of the year's Nobel Prizewinners were Jews in itself testifies to the intellectual and cultural role of the Jew
