PREMIER MAY NAME NEW DEPUTY MINISTER

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Menachem Begin has succeeded in reshuffling his Cabinet in the wake of the resignation of Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan naming Yigal Hurwitz as Finance Minister, and the present Finance Minister Simcha Ehrlich, as a second Deputy Premier.

Begin will continue to serve temporarily as Foreign Minister although he may name a deputy minister to assist him. The newgovernment was drafted by Begin, Ehrlich, Deputy Premier Yigael Yadin of the Democratic Movement and Interior Minister Yosef Burg.

Yadin had earlier officially rejected an offer to become Foreign Minister and Burg who had also been mentioned for the post said he preferred to remain in the Interior Ministry.

Ehrlich, a leader of the Liberal Party, had been under heavy criticism for his handling of the economy. Hurwitz, a member of the small ultranational Laam faction of Likud, had resigned as Commerce Minister last year because of his opposition to the Camp David agreement. Begin also announced that Minister - Without - Portfolio Moshe Nissim, a member of the Liberal Party, will become Minister of Information, a new post in the Begin government.
