Dear Editor:

Many Americans are looking for a way to express concern for their fellow citizens being held hostage in Iran that is consistent with this country's respect for law. As you know, the American Charge in Iran, Bruce Laingen, who is being held at the Foreign Ministry, has suggested that church bells be rung each noon until the hostages are released. Several members of Congress and the Attorney General also have suggested that Americans write the Iranian Mission at the United Nations to demand release of the hostages.

The President endorses these suggestions. It is of overriding importance that Iranian authorities understand that Americans are united in their determination not to yield to blackmail and in the demand for the safe return of the hostages. Your support for these two suggestions will help prevent any miscalculation of where Americans stand in this time of crisis.


To the Editor:

Terroran !

Perhaps the name of the capital of Iran should be re - spelled as Terroran.

The true nature of the Iman whose name sounds like Haman is now exposed for all to see.

What makes the hostage crisis doubly vexing is that the Khomeini is not giving Persia a bad name, but religion.

He poses as a religionist. But his fellow-Moslem, Sadat, has called him a lunatic.

He pretends that he is opposed to tyranny. He condemns the Shah for being cruel. But he is himself both despotic and barbaric.

And his religion is decidedly ersatz. No truly moral person would be guilty of the vileness he has displayed.

The grim crisis should teach the world another lesson: if you don't put a stop to barbarism when it rears its ugly visage, you will be overrun with barbarism.

The world's tolerance of the PLO is directly responsible for the hijacking of our Iran embassy. The first embassy to be seized by the Iman's followers was the Israeli one. The first hand shaken by the Persian garu was that of Arafat.

There is a direct line between the deference shown to the PLO killers and the vicious seizure of American embassies and the torment to which we in the U.S. have been subjected.

The crisis has done one thing: it has united Americans as never before. A surge of pro-American patriotism has been the by-product of the terrorism practised by the so-called students of "Terroran." May the unity remain, and may our hostages be freed!
