

DI GOLF CLASSIC

There aren't enough marquee names in Las Vegas to list the number of stars that will be playing at the Desert Inn Country Club March 20 - 23.

That's when the DI stages the most lucrative golf event in the history of Nevada -- the \$200,000 LPGA National Pro-Am.

The 72-hole tournament, presented by J&B Rare Scotch, will bring together 90 of the world's best women golfers and 270 amateurs to the course that is the original home of the prestigious Tournament of Champions.

Heading the field of lady pros is Nancy Lopez, who won last year's National Pro-Am when it was played at the Sahara CC. Her 274 total was the lowest score recorded in 1979.

Also in the lineup are Donna Caponi Young, JoAnne Carner, Penny Pulz, Chako Higuchi, Amy Alcott, Judy Rankin, JoAnn Washam and Sandra Post, rounding out the Top 10 finishers.

Other entrants include Pat Bradley, Sally Little, Beth Daniel, Hollis Stacy, Jan Stephenson, Jerilyn Britz, Laura Baugh, Marlene Floyd and Hall - of - Famer Kathy Whitworth.

The Celebrity list is a roster of Who's Who, topped off by former President Gerald R. Ford.

Other celebs include: Claude Akins (star of TV's "Misadventures of Sheriff Lobo"); all-around entertainers Pat

Boone and Glen Campbell; Jim Davis (star of TV's "Dallas"); Joe DiMaggio (New York Yankees Hall - of - Famer); Fred DeCordova (producer of the "Tonight Show"); Chad Everett (star of the new TV series "Hagen"); comedian George Gobel, TV game show host and master emcee Monte Hall; Christopher Lee (star of "Dracula"); highly acclaimed actor Fred MacMurray; TV star and game show host Peter Marshall, Telly and Gus Savalas (stars of TV's "Kojak"); Bob Urich (star of TV's smash hit "Vega\$"); Fred Williamson (former Los Angeles Rams player - turned actor); Efrem Zimbalist, Jr. (star of the recent TV mini-series hit "Scrupes").

The tournament, which will see \$30,000 go to the winner, will be played over the plush 6,237-yard, par 72 Desert Inn course and the 6,134-yard, par 72 Paradise Valley CC layout.

MEL ALLEN AND AL ROSEN

NAMED TO JEWISH HALL OF FAME

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The United States Committee Sports for Israel has named 11 individuals to be inducted into the Jewish Sports Hall of Fame, located at the Wingate Institute of Physical Education in Netanya, Israel, the committee's chairman, Nat Holman, announced here.

Among those inducted are: the late Eddie Gottlieb, one of the founders of the National Basketball Association; Harry Litwack, the long-time Temple University basketball coach; Al Rosen, a former baseball player for the Cleveland Indians and once President of the New York Yankees; Barney Dreyfus, owner of the Pittsburgh Pirates from 1900 - 1932 who originated the World Series; Ron Mix, one-time offensive lineman

for the San Diego Chargers of the American Football League, and Marshall Goldberg, an all-American halfback at the University of Pittsburgh in 1937 - 38.

Also named were Lillian Copeland, the 1932 Gold Medallist in the discus; Lon Meyers, considered the greatest runner of the 19th century; Isaac Berger, who won a gold medal for the U.S. in weightlifting in the 1956 Olympics; and Gretel Bergman (Mrs. Bruno Lambert), who, despite breaking the Olympic women's high jump mark in a pre-Olympic competition in 1936 was dropped from the German Olympic team. The list is rounded out by Mel Allen, one of the most popular sports broadcasters for the last 30 years.

TEN TERRORISTS GET JAIL TERMS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Ten terrorists captured in an attempted seaborne attack on Eilat last September were given stiff jail sentences by a military tribunal in Lod. The leader of the group, Abdallah Daud Jaroud, and his second in command, were each sentenced to 25 years in jail.

The others received sentences of 8 - 11 years. Eight of the men were crew members of a Panamanian flag ship and sailed from the Syrian port of Latakia where senior Syrian officers installed Katyusha rocket launchers to be used in an attack on Eilat.
