have been established on the territory of the former Palestinian Mandate," he declared. "One is the Palestinian Arab state of Jordan, which achieved national self - determination independence and sovereignty in 1946. The other is the Palestinian Jewish State of Israel which became independent in 1948."

No actual vote is expected before July at the earliest. West European members of the Council, including France have decided not to endorse the resolution pending Carter's meetings with Sadat and Begin and wehther the autonomy talks will be concluded by the May 26 target date.

Another reason is the European Economic Community (EEC) summit meeting in July at which time the subject of Palestinian independence is expected to be discussed.

At the Council session, Egyptian Ambassador Achmed Ismat Meguid declared that "Egypt's commitment to the Palestinian cause is total and unwavering." He condemned Israel for establishing new settlements on the West Bank and for expropriating Arab - owned land in East Jerusalem and elsewhere.

These moves by Israel "created serious obstacles which hinder the faithful implementation of the Camp David accords under which Israel is committed to honor the rights of the Palestinian people." Meguid defended the Camp David agreements against their Arab critics and declared that the accords were only a first step, not a final Middle East settlement.

"At Camp David, Egypt extracted for the first time from Israel a pledge to apply Security Council Resolution 242 to the West Bank and Gaza and to recognize the legitimate rights of the Palestinian people and to receive the Palestinian question in all its aspects," Meguid said.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Egyptian Ambassador Saad Martada has told Premier Menachem Begin that Egyptian Prime Minister Mustapha Khalil will host a special reception for Israeli Ambassador Eliahu Ben - Elissar in Cairo. Begin has expressed concern about news reports over Ben - Elissar's social isolation in Cairo.
