MIRIAM SHEARING SEEKS JUDICIAL POST

Justice of the Peace Miriam Shearing, the first woman ever elected to a judicial post in Las Vegas, became a candidate for District Court Judge when she filed for the seat formerly held by the late Judge Keith Hayes.

Judge Shearing, 45, has twice been elected to the post she currently holds and has been an attorney for more than 15 years.

"At this point in my judicial career, I believe that my experience is appropriate to meet the challenges and responsibilities of handling the wide variety of cases in District Court," she said.

Judge Shearing was admitted to the Nevada Bar in 1969 and is admitted to practice in all California courts, U.S. District

Court for the Southern District of California, U.S. District Court for the District of Nevada and U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit.

She holds membership in the American Judges Association, Nevada Judges Association, American Bar Association, California State Bar, Clark County Bar Association, Washoe County Bar Association and American Judicature Society.

Long active in community events, Judge Shearing is a Director of the Las Vegas Family Abuse Center, a member of the advisory board of Temporary Assistance to Women, a member of the American Association of University Women, Clark County Medical Association Auxiliary and Southern Nevada Allied Arts Council.

Judge Shearing received her B.A. from Cornell University in 1956 and her law degree from Boston College Law School in 1964.

The wife of Las Vegas eye surgeon Steven P. Shearing, and mother of three, she was named "Professional Mother of the Year" earlier this month.



HARLEY

Harley L. Harmon, majority leader of the Nevada Assembly, announced today he will seek reelection in Assembly District 16.

The Las Vegas democrat also served in a leadership position during the 1977 legislative session when he was elected Assembly speaker pro-tem.

Harmon, 32, was first elected to the legislature in 1974. He was named "Outstanding Freshman Assemblyman" during his first term.

He was chairman of the Commerce Committee and vice chairman of the Government Affairs

Committee in 1977, in addition to his duties as speaker pro-tem.

While serving as majority leader during the 1979 session, he also served as vice chairman of the Government Affairs Committee and as a member of the Election Committee. He compiled a 94.5 per cent voting record during the session.

Harmon presently is chairman of the Interim Legislative Study Committee on Data Processing.

Harmon cited "continuing fiscal responsibility which allowed us to pass the largest tax relief package in Nevada history" as the most important accomplishment of the 1979 legislature.

Harmon said he would back continued general fund support for fish and game programs during the 1981 legislature, as well as continued strict gaming controls and programs for better transportation and better roads.

BOB ROBINSON: EIGHT YEAR VETERAN

Assemblyman Bob Robinson, vice chairman of the Assembly Commerce Committee and an eight-year veteran of the Nevada Legislature, announced he will seek reelection in District 8.

The Las Vegas democrat said major issues facing the

1981 legislature will be "reapportionment, continued fiscal responsibility, tougher criminal laws and matters involving growth and transportation."

Robinson said major accomplishments of the last legislature included major new criminal laws, stricter gaming controls, a massive tax reduction package including property tax reduction and repeal of the sales tax on food and repeal of the personal property tax.

Robinson, 56, is an optometrist who is the only assemblyman in Nevada history to win election to two Assembly districts.
