IN 14-0 RESOLUTION

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The Security Council voted 14 - 0 to condemn "the assassination attempts on the lives of the Arab mayors of Nablus, Ramallah and El Bireh." The resolution called "for the immediate apprehension and prosecution of the perpetrators of these crimes' and expressed concern that Israel 'has failed to provide adequate protection to the civilian population in the occupied territories."

The resolution also demanded that Israel pay compensation to the victims. The United States abstained although Ephraim Evron, Israel's Ambassador to the U.S., had earlier in the day asked Vice President Walter Mondale and Secretary of State Edmund Muskie for a U.S. veto. Speaking before the Council vote, Yehuda Blum, Israel's Ambassador to the UN, said Is-

Vance and Israel

SPECIAL INTERVIEW WITH CYRUS VANCE

It was past midnight on March 4, 1979 when President Carter came home from the Middle East. A hero's welcome greeted him at Andrews Air Force Base as he returned in triumph from his historic visit to Jerusalem and Cairo. He had just wrapped up the Egyptian-Israeli peace treaty.

At a microphone, under television lights, the President paused for a moment, then asked Secretary of State Cyrus Vance to join him in receiving the plaudits of the crowd. It was fitting recognition of Vance's contribution to the making of that treaty. Negotiator par excellence, Vance never lost sight of the ultimate objective in obtaining the settlement. According to members of the negotiating teams, he put forward the innovative ideas and hammered out formulations that made possible the first peace treaty between Israel and an Arab country since the Jewish state came into being 32 years ago.

Today, the just - departed Secretary of State singles out that peace treaty as one of the most important accomplishments of his enure, because, Vance told me in an interview, peace is vital to Israel's future.

The Treaty was signed twelve days later (March 26) on the front lawn of the White House. That evening at the largest State Dinner in White House history, Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin paid special honor to Vance. With Egyptian President Anwar Sadat and President Carter flanking him, Begin told 1400 guests seated at tables under a huge tent on the South Lawn: "I would like to pay tribute to a man who is the main foreign policy adviser of the President of the United States, and my friend. He knows all the legal formulations, all the
