

TWINS MISS GRADUATION

Susan and Lynn Stein did not attend their high school graduation Saturday (June 7) in Fairfax, Va.

Twin sisters and class valedictorians -- and Orthodox Jews -- they sought unsuccessfully to change the date of the graduation of W. T. Woodson High School from

Saturday to another day, arguing that their religious freedom was abridged because of the Sabbath commencement.

The American Jewish Congress filed a friend-of-the-court brief in support of the Stein sisters' suit. The National Council of Churches in Christ joined in the brief.

The Virginia Supreme Court refused to issue an injunction against the Saturday graduation, upholding a ruling by the Circuit Court of Fairfax County.

Meanwhile, the girls' parents are working with the American Jewish Congress on the possibility of appealing

the decision to the United States Supreme Court.

In its brief, the American Jewish Congress argued:

"Because attendance at commencement is a privilege and a benefit which the school bestows on those who have earned it, in the absence of compelling reasons the school cannot condition its enjoyment on the relinquishment of the First Amendment's guarantee of the right to the free exercise of religion."

CABINET LIKES CARTER'S STAND

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Cabinet said that it appreciated the firm opposition of President Carter and Secretary of State Edmund Muskie to a proposed new Middle East initiative by the West European nations. The Cabinet said it also appreciated the President's warning that the U. S. would veto any European move in the United Nations Security Council to alter or discard Resolution 242.

Carter declared in an interview in-

augurating a new all-news cable television network June 1, that the U.S. would exercise its veto if its European allies or any other nation attempted an initiative that would damage the Camp David peace process which is based on Resolution 242. Carter also predicted that the stalled autonomy talks between Egypt, Israel and the U.S. would be resumed shortly.

The President repeated his veto threat on the CBS television program "Meet The Press."
