ISRAEL AND EGYPT AGREE TO WASHINGTON AUTONOMY TALKS

BEGIN URGES JEWS TO LEAVE IRAN

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- All Jews should leave Iran as soon as possible, Premier Menachem Begin declared. "We would prefer, of course, that they come to Israel, but the main thing is that they leave because they are in real danger," Begin told a meeting of the Coordinating Committee of Iranian Immigrants in Israel. Likud MK Moshe Katsav, chairman of the meeting, noted that Iran allows its citizens to leave but under severe restrictions with respect to what property and assets they can take with them. Begin and Katsav seemed to imply that Iranian Jews should flee as soon as possible because

of the recent "judicial" moves against some Jews in Iran. "They do not seem to realize the danger of their situation," Katsav told reporters.

The warnings by Begin and Katsav came in the wake of the execution in Hamadan, Iran, of Albert Danielpour, an Iranian Jew. The 52-year-old Danielpour was accused of cooperation with the CIA and Israeli intelligence and with helping to establish the "Zionist government of Israel."

CABINET AGREES TO STOP INFLATION BY BUDGET CUT

JERUSALEM (WN) -- The Cabinet agreed to Finance Minister Yigal Hurwitz's demand and decided to cut \$320 - \$350 million from this year's budget, but did not specify where the cuts would be made. The Cabinet decided, at a special marathon session which ended early June 19, to pare the Defense budget by \$150 million.

The rest will obviously come from the civilian budgets. The Ministerial Economic Conference will have to decide how much each ministry is to cut from its budget.

SEN. MUSKIE SEEKS TO CONTINUE CAMP DAVID AGREEMENTS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Israel and Egypt have agreed to send their chief negotiators to Washington to discuss the resumption of the talks on autonomy for the West Bank and Gaza Strip. White House Press Secretary Jody Powell, in making the announcement, said no date has been set for the meeting between Israeli Interior Minister Yosef Burg, Egyptian Foreign Minister Kamal Hassan Ali and Special U.S. Ambassador Sol Linowitz.

The talks are not expected to be held before the end of the month after President Carter's meetings with King Hussein of Jordan and after the President returns from a trip to Europe.

Observers here acknowledged that setting a date for the talks, broken off originally by Egyptian President Anwar Sadat on May 15, does not require a face-to-face meeting. But apparently the three countries want to hold a heads-of-delegation session as a tangible symbol that the crisis involving the passing of the May 26 target date for an agreement has now ended. "All parties recognize it is essential to pursue negotiations to a

In the Jewish religion it is proper to mark the gravesite of one who has passed about 10 to 11 months after burial. The 15 minute ceremony is conducted by a rabbi and is called the unveiling.

It amounts to the first time the family and friends of the deceased are allowed to visit the grave for worship or reflection. It also marks the first time the deceased person's stone is shown or unveiled to loved ones.

Why the wait? After their tried and tested rituals over the centuries, the wise men of the Jewish religion felt a 10 to 11 month waiting period would ease the pain of the first visit back to the burial spot. Who are we to question the wisdom of a religion which brought us circumcision, kosher foods and Jewish mothers? So we waited.

Then last Monday morning a small caravan of cars rode slowly to the Oakes Section of Woodlawn Cemetery in North Las Vegas to honor the memory of Jack Tell who passed away in August of 1979.

The worshiping group included his wife, Bea, his three sons, Don, Jay and Mike, and their
