BEGIN URGES AMERICAN JEWS TO FIGHT SALE OF ARMS TO ARABS

ISRAEL WARNS SECURITY COUNCIL AGAINST PREJUDICE

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- As the Security Council began a debate on Jerusalem, Israeli Ambassador Yehuda Blum warned it "not to permit the voice of intolerance and prejudice to prevail." The debate was requested by Pakistan, representing the Islamic Conference, "to examine the dangerous situation arising from the latest decision by the Israeli authorities seeking to annex and declare Al Quds Al Sharif (the Holy City of Jerusalem) as the capital of Israel." Pakistan Foreign Minister Agha Shahi accused Israel of an "obsessive Zionist scheme to

Judaize the Holy City." He called on the Council to "bring all possible pressure or the Israeli authorities to rescind forthwith the administrative and juridical measures taken by them to annex and to destroy the character of the Al Quds since its occupation." Blum, replying after several Islamic Conference spokesmen gave their view, said, "We have heard in this meeting, right from the beginning the shrill voice of hatred, incitement and fanaticism." He urged the Council not to succumb "to an evil that has brought so much misery not only in the past, but even in our own time."

EGYPTIAN ATTACKS ISRAEL OVER JERUSALEM

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- In a lengthy address before the Security Council debating a Pakistani complaint against Israel over the issue of Jerusalem, the Acting Egyptian Permanent Representative Nabil A. Elaraby last week viciously attacked the Jewish state charging it "with predatory designs on Arab Jerusalem." Ambassador Elaraby, speaking in the Council in the absence of Permanent Ambassador Meguid went on with his diatribe as if there had been no peace signed by Israel

and his country. "Israel," he stated, "has consistently refused to comply with all the previous injunctions of the Council. Notwithstanding Israel's sustained proclivity to defy the will of the community of nations," he charged, "my delegation firmly believes that it would be erroneous to assume that these resolutions have no value or are destined to be shelved and to languish in the archives of the UN without exerting a real effect."

ISRAELITE ADS PAY

CARTER PLANS TO SUPPLY F-15 JETS AND M-60 TANKS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Menachem Begin has urged American Jews to fight the Carter Administration's plan to sell advanced weaponry to Jordan and Saudi Arabia. He made his plea recently at the closing session of the week-long meeting of the Zionist General Council.

He said Israel was deeply concerned by Saudi Arabia's demand for sophisticated equipment that would enable its F-15 interceptor jets to attack targets in Israel and also by U.S. plans to provide Jordan with modern M-60 tanks. There has been no decision by the Carter Administration so far on the Saudi request for extra fuel tanks to increase the F-15's operational range as well to equip them with bomb racks.

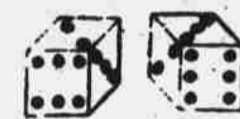

So what if our tires were a little low or the car needed a minor tune or lube job. He was the boss. He could say, "Sorry, out of Gas!"

Now the same thing is happening right before our eyes between some of the larger gambling institutions in our town.

Del Webb's Sahara tops them all. They give away a new 1980 Datsun every night at 10:30 P.M. We don't recall how many cars they have given to the lucky winners of a free drawing but it's about 25 or 30. And you should see the place every evening. It looks like New Year's Eve.
