Political Hopefuls BREMNER RUNS FOR STH TERM



Assemblyman Roger Bremner, vice chairman of the Ways and Committee, Means announced today he will seek reelection to a fifth term in the Nevada Assembly.

Bremner, 42, said the major challenges of the 1980's "will be responsifinancial and sound, bility planning to fiscal insure that we can meet the needs of the people while still maintaining our traditional budget surpluses.'

Bremner has served on the powerful Ways and Means Committee -- the comwhich apmittee proves all state expenditures -- since 1975. He was elevated to vice chairman of the committee in 1977 and served in that same position during the 1979 session.

"It was the sound fiscal practices of the money committees and the legislature as a whole which led to the largest tax reduction package in Nevada history," Breining history, "The package included property tax elimination relief, of the sales tax food and repeal of the personal property tax."

Bremner warned that "recession and uncertain economic times are upon us, and we will be even more greatly challenged to insure that the expenditures we approve are carefully examined and thoroughly justified."
