NEW YORK (WNS) -- A federal district court in Chicago has awarded \$40,000 in back pay and damages to a Sabbath observer who could not take an examination for a civil service job because given on a it was Saturday.

Howard Zuckerman, president of the National Jewish Commission on Law and Affairs Public (COLPA) said this was the largest amount ever awardedin a case of job discrimination for a Sabbath observer and the first time damages awarded based on what somewould have been earning if he had received the job rather than a Sabbath observer dismissed after having the job already.
