HAM VIES FOR ASSEMBLY

Jane Ham announces that she will seek election to the office of Assembly District 16. Ham, a Republican, has been a resident of Las Vegas and her Assembly District for 25 years, and is well known for her activities in political and civic affairs.

Ham is President of the Republican Women of Las Vegas, Public Relations Chairman of both the Nevada and the National Federation of Republican Women, a member of the Republican State Central Committee and a member of the Executive Board of the Clark County Republican Central Committee, which she served as Secretary and for two terms as Second Vice Chairman. Ham was an alternate to the Republican National Convention in 1976.

Ham is a Director of the Las Vegas chapter of Zonta International, a business and professional woman's service organization, a member of the Women's Auxiliary of the Las Vegas NAACP, a member of Pro Family Coalition, the Conservative Caucus, Women's Political Caucus, the League of Women Vo-

ters and the National Taxpayers' Association. She is clerk of the Vestry of St. Mary-the-Virgin Anglican Catholic Church, and a member of St. Rose de Lima Hospital Auxiliary.

It is Ham's second bid for the District 16 Assembly seat. She ran in the 1978 election and was defeated by only 867 votes out of almost 8000 total.

Ham pledges mature, responsible and full time representation in the state Legislature for the people of Nevada. She stresses the need for constant vigilance over state expenditures. "The number one issue in Nevada this year is inflation and the high cost of everything that we have to buy," says Ham. "We will have to look carefully at any bills that call for new or increased taxes or expenditures of taxpayers' money. The tax free status of food and personal property should be continued."

Ham resides at 6637 Surrey Street, her home for 25 years, with her two daughters and son-in-law.

KORIE RUNS FOR JUSTICE OF PEACE

Harry K. Korie recently announced he has filed for the office of Justice of the Peace. His statement is as follows:

"I'm Harry Kane Korie, first Special Hearing Master for the Justice Court, and candidate for Justice of the Peace in the September 9, 1980 election in Las Vegas

Township.

I believe in speedy trials and am willing to sit on a four-day Night Arraignment Court. That would help alleviate the overcrowded jail conditions.

Many persons have been and are currently detained in the County Jail who do not belong there. Persons, for example, who are held on misdemeanor charges do not belong in an overcrowded jail with convicted felons.

I oppose placing in custody, first-offender misdemeanor cases, where they come into contact with hardened felons. This does not contribute to the system of justice and causes needless hardship.

I will appreciate your support for my position."

JUDGE GOLDMAN FOR SUPREME COURT

Judge Goldman recently announced he is a candidate for Justice of the Supreme Court of Nevada. His statement is as follows: "During these years, I have served two terms as chief judge, I have sat on the Supreme Court at various times as a designated judge, I have presided over criminal and civil matters in several other judicial districts in this state, and I have appeared before the Legislature to alert that body to changes in the law and court facilities

made necessary by our statewide crime explosion.

Long ago, I made a commitment to work for improvement of Nevada's system of justice. I believe I can best fulfill that commitment as a Justice of the Supreme Court of Nevada."

CAB DRIVER SEEKS CONSTABLE SEAT

Las Vegas cab driver Ron Nicolai has joined a 14-way race for election to the office of Las Vegas Township constable.

Nicolai, 50, says his 12 years of experience as a police officer in Torrance and Palos Verdes Estates, California, qualify him for the office of constable.

A Republican, Nicolai was defeated by W.N. "Woody" Cole in the 1978 race for constable. He is a Korean War veteran and spent three years at Harvard Junior College studying police science.

Nicolai, a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1753, resides at 6304 Brittany Way with his wife, Sandra, and son John, 15. He has lived in Las Vegas for 12 years.

The constable's duties include collecting small claims and serving papers for civil court proceedings.

Mr. Nicolai's credentials also include: 12 years active police officer in Palos Verdes Estates and City of Torrance Police Departments; 3 years

Harbor Junior College accumulating 60 college units in Police Science, 2 years Insurance Claims Work, 2 years serving civil court orders in civilian capacity, Chief Investigator 2 years for Private Detective, 2 years security here in Las Vegas, 8 years U.S. Navy, Occupation of Japan Forces and Korean War, Member of Torrance Police Association and V.F.W. Post 1753 Veteran Korean War and Japanese Occupation.

Mr. Nicolai states his 8 years of driving a cab in Las Vegas has helped him to understand the wage earner and his problems.
