Known as the Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur Day brings to a close the "Ten days It is the Jewish be-of repentance," which lief that at sundown began with Rosh Hash-

onah, the first day of God seals the Book of the Jewish New Year, 5741, Sept. 11th.

Since Biblical times, Yom Kippur is the day set aside to forgiveness of man's sins against man and God. Traditionally, religious Jews observe a 24 - hour period of total abstinence from food and drink.

The traditional Yizkor Services, memorializing the dead, will take place at 4:00 P.M. on Yom Kippur Day.
