

YOM KIPPUR BEGINS TONIGHT AT SUNDOWN

Yom Kippur, recognized as the holiest day of the Jewish year, will be observed by Jewish people throughout the free world, beginning at sundown Friday, Sept. 19th and ending at nightfall Saturday, Sept. 20th. Known as the Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur Day brings to a close the "Ten days of repentance," which began with Rosh Hash-

onah, the first day of the Jewish New Year, 5741, Sept. 11th.

Since Biblical times, Yom Kippur is the day set aside to ask forgiveness of man's sins against man and God. Traditionally, religious Jews observe a 24-hour period of total abstinence from food and drink.

It is the Jewish belief that at sundown on Yom Kippur Day,

God seals the Book of Life, in which he has written the fate of every individual. Yom Kippur is also referred to as the "Day of Judgement" and so the day is spent in religious worship.

Services begin on Friday evening with the recitation of the Kol Nidre prayer and will be brought to a symbolic finish with a single blast of the

Shofar, the ram's horn, at the close of special Nilah services just prior to sundown Saturday.

In Las Vegas, a capacity crowd of more than 1200 people will attend services at Temple Beth Sholom, 1600 E. Oakey Blvd., at 6:30 P.M. Friday and from 9:00 A.M. to sundown on Saturday, according to Herb Kaufman, Temple President.

Services will be conducted by Rabbi Kalman Appel who will deliver the special High Holiday sermons. Cantor Simon Bergman

will chant the liturgy, assisted by the Temple High Holiday Choir, under the direction of Dr. Barry Fisher. Martha Olson will be at the organ.

The traditional Yizkor Services, memorializing the dead, will take place at 4:00 P.M. on Yom Kippur Day.

For the convenience of all Hotel Jewish staff personnel, as well as for Jewish clientele visiting our city Temple Beth Sholom will hold special Yizkor Memorial Services at Caesars Palace, on Saturday, Sept. 20th, every hour on the hour,

from 11:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M., and more frequently, if necessary. Kaufman stated that admission to the services at Caesars Palace will be free, and anyone wishing to attend is most welcome.
