

AUTONOMY TALKS TO RESUME SHORTLY

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Egypt and Israel have agreed to resume soon the negotiations for autonomy for the Palestinians on the West Bank and Gaza Strip and then hold a summit conference in Washington after the Presidential elections. The agreement, the result of special U.S. Ambassador Sol Linowitz's trip to Israel and Egypt, was announced by President Carter during a White House meeting with officials of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal employees. Carter told the union officials he had just talked with Linowitz on the phone from Alexandria, Egypt where the envoy had met with Egyptian President Anwar Sadat. Linowitz had apparently gotten Israeli Premier Menachem Begin to agree to Sadat's request for the Camp David - style summit and Sadat to agree to Begin's demand that the autonomy talks, called off four times by Sadat since last May, be resumed first.

Linowitz issued an official statement in Alexandria saying that both Begin and Sadat "are and remain firmly committed to the Camp David accords and are convinced that they offer the only viable path

toward a comprehensive peace in the Middle East. Both are determined to see that the process leads to a successful conclusion regardless of temporary difficulties that may arise along the way." Linowitz said "the parties recognize that for the negotiations to succeed they must rest on a firm foundation of mutual trust and friendship, and they undertake to strengthen that foundation in the coming weeks." He added "the parties agreed to resume the autonomy negotiations at a mutually agreed date and to consult regarding the preparation, venue and timing of a summit meeting."
