

JACKSON URGES WEST TO AID EMIGRATION

WASH. (WNS) -- and other Western countries to renew efforts to help Soviet Jews and others

emigrate. Jackson told the Senate that there "are many reasons" why the Soviet Union has placed obstacles to emigration. "One reason may be that they think the United States and the West

do not really care anymore," he said. Jackson, the principal author of the Jackson Vanik Amendment linking U.S. trade benefits to increased Soviet emigration, said "at

one time the fate of Soviet Jewry and the cause of free emigration were a primary subject in public attention. Of late, public attention has focussed on Iran, Afghanistan, Camp Da-

vid negotiations, Poland and the Iran-Iraqi war." Jackson said it was "high time to make abundantly clear that we do care about those denied their fundamental right to emigrate."

leaders and Israeli officials have charged that Palestinian terrorists groups and the Libyan regime have worked together with the anti-Semitic neo-Nazi groups in Europe.

Although demonstrations took place immediately after the bomb attack and the days following it, the biggest demonstration was when 100,000 to 200,000 persons marched through Paris denouncing racism. "Jews and non-Jews, we are fighting the same battle," they declared as they walked in disciplined ranks. The National Assembly (Parliament) adjourned by unanimous vote so that the members could join the march. The march, organized by the Human Rights Movement Against Racism and for Peace, followed the traditional Labor Day route from the Place de la Nation to the Place de la Republique a distance of two miles. Other mass demonstrations took place elsewhere in France: 7000 in Aix en Provence; 2000 in Avignon; 2000 in Besancon; 10,000 in Bordeaux; 7000 in Grenoble; 4000 in Lille; 6000 in Lyons, 6000 in Montpellier; 2000 in Orleans, 2500 in Rheims; 500 in Strasbourg and 20,000 in Marseilles.

Yet at the same time other anti-Jewish incidents were taking place. In Nice, on the Riviera, a powerful firecracker was thrown at demonstrators denouncing anti-Semitism. A Jewish butcher shop in Nice was ransacked and anti-Semitic slogans were scrawled on the walls. In Marseilles, a homemade bomb that failed to explode was found by police outside a Jewish-owned restaurant. The owner said he and other Jewish businessmen had received threatening messages from FANE. Members of FANE claimed responsibility for smashing windows of a Jewish-owned clothing store in Troyes in eastern France.
