"The propagation of hatred and bigotry in the name of religion on a global scale is of itself a cause of great concern." But when, as today, such hatred and bigotry are combined with the economic power of Arab petro-dollars and oil blackmail, the potential danger facing the world becomes all the more awesome. The arrogance of the Arab petro - hegomonists has been repeatedly demonstrated by overt threats. by bribery and by attempts to dictate to free countries how they should act in the international arena, how they should vote here in this Assembly and even what they can show on their television screens...

The unholy combination of bigotry and oil blackmail is of itself a cause of great concern. But beyond that, wher invective and the unbridled power of oil are then put at the service of international terror, the dangers facing the world are further compounded. If we are honest with ourselves, we must admit that the United Nations must also take some of the blame for the spread of international terrorism, particularly since the murderous attack on the Israeli athletes at the Munich Olympics in 1972, Intimidated by oil blackmail, this body has been immobilized in the face of the scourge of terror. Not only had it been unable to go beyond sterile rhetoric, it has in fact tacitly and overtly supported international terror.



Opportunism of Hussein

King Hussein of Jordan, long the favorite of the United States government and the American media, is now showing his true colors in the Iraqi - Iranian war; that of a blatant opportunist.

Hussein has long posed as the gallant young monarch who would be willing to make peace with Israel if only the other Arab countries would let him. Like his grandfather, King Abdullah, he claimed to enter into war against Israel only reluctantly, forced by pressure from his fellow A rab countries.

Now, when some Arab voices would be helpful in putting an end to the Iraqi - Iranian war which threatens to become an even wider conflict, Hussein does not even have the grace of taking his former stance of remaining quiet. Instead, he has become the leading Arab spokesman in support of Iraq. Soviet bloc countries supply Iraq through the Jordanian port of Aqaba, just across from the Israeli port of Eilat. Hussein has gone to other countries, particularly Saudi Arabia, to urge their support for Iraq

There have been several reasons given for his position, all of which reveal opportunism. One is that he hopes Jordan will benefit if Iraq gains control of the Iranian oilfields. The other is that the hope that this show of support for Arab "rights" will win him back Arab support for his control of the West Bank which the Arab countries gave to the Palestine Liberation Organization instead.

This is the man who has refused to support the Camp David accords despite his reported desire for peacepand the years of American support for his regime. This is the man who talks of Israeli occupation but forgets that for 19 years Jordan was the occupying power on the West Bank, during which Hussein mentioned nothing about Palestinian rights or a Palestinian state. This is a man who denies Israel's right to govern all of Jerusalem, while for the 19
