Carter received 40 percent of the Jewish vote, Reagan 37 percent, Anderson 17 percent. In New York, 51 percent of the Jews voted

for Carter, 37 percent for Reagan and nine percent for Anderson. This was seen in a check of New York City voting areas where Carter was seen winning by a large margin in some Jewish areas and by a very slim one in others. Only in the Borough Park section of Brooklyn, where the largest concentration of Orthodox Jews in the United States live, did Reagan receive the majority of the vote.

However, the Coalition for Reagan-Bush, the Jewish organization set up last summer in support of the Republican candidates, claimed that the Jewish vote split evenly. With both Carter and Reagan receiving 45 percent and Anderson 10 percent. The Jewish voter contributed to Reagan's victory at an "historically high level in most of the key states," the

Coalition said. Coalition chairman Albert Spiegel, of Los Angeles, said that "We are confident that Governor Reagan as President will fulfill his commitments to the people of the United States, including its Jewish community."

George Klein, a New York businessman and national co-chairman of the Coalition, said Reagan had received the "highest percentage of the Jewish vote of any Republican Presidential candidate in history" because of Reagan's "strong pro - Israel position," his views on the national economy and military prepared-ness. Alfred Moses, the Washington lawyer who serves as President Carter's liason to the Jewish community, said it was too early to analyze the Jewish vote. However, he noted "there were defections among Jews as among all constituent groups" of the Democratic Party. "It is hard to say whether this is an aberra-tion or a longer term trend," he said.

Premier Menachem Begin of Israel cabled congratulations to President - elect Reagan saying he "look(s) forward to close and fruitful cooperation between our countries for the cause of peace and liberty.' He also sent a message to Carter expressing thanks "on behalf of the people and government of Israel for your friendship, your great contribution to Is-rael's security and incessant efforts to bring about peace in the Middle East."

Begin, who arrived in the United States

#### recently scheduled a meeting with Carter and has asked for a meeting with Reagan. Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir said Israel hoped that the identity of interest between it and the U.S., which Reagan stressed during his election campaign. will find greater expression than before. Both Opposition Labor Party leaders Shimon Peres and Yitzhak Rabin welcomed the Reagan victory. Peres, chairman of the Labor Party, noted that Reagan favors a Jordanian solution of the Palestinian problem which coincides with the Labor Party's position.

PARIS (WNS) -- Issam Sartawi, a top aide to Palestine Liberation Organization chief Yasir Arafat met with one of President Valery Giscard d'Estaing's diplomatic representatives. It was the first known official contact between the office of the French President and a PLO representative. Sartawi, who is also the PLO representative in Vienna, handed over a letter to Giscard by Arafat informing him of the PLO's leader's efforts to try to mediate a ceasefire between Iran and Iraq.

CLEVELAND (WNS) -- Rabbi Shlomo Goren, Israel's Chief Ashkenazic Rabbi, was reported resting comfortably at the Cleveland Clinic here after undergoing a quadruple bypass operation.
