

WEISENTHAL TALKS OF HATE GROUPS

NEW YORK -- "The number of persons in groups and organizations who still worship Hitler, hate Jews, mock democracy and wait for the right moment to seize power simply could be much larger than many of us think," warned the famed Nazi hunter Simon Wiesenthal recently.

In reference to recent events, Mr. Wiesenthal said: "There is a regeneration of the ideas of yesterday, with again a poisoning of people's minds which means a renewed danger for us."

Mr. Wiesenthal received the Justice Louis D. Brandeis Award of the Zionist Organization of America for bringing nearly 1,000 Nazi war criminals to the bar of justice. The presentation, by Ivan J. Novick, President of the ZOA, was made at a banquet sponsored by the ZOA's New York Metropolitan Regions at the Sheraton Centre here.

The Brandeis Award is a bust of the late Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis, pioneer American Zionist. "The award is given to those who epitomize the essence of Zionist commitment and com-

munity service, as emulated by the eminent jurist," said Mr. Novick.

Both Senator Jacob K. Javits and Mr. Novick addressed the gathering.

Citing the premise that the number of those who still worship Hitler and hate Jews could be larger than we think, Mr. Wiesenthal pointed out that this development "is partly due to the fact that half the world's population was born after the war and that ten percent of the other half were small children at that time -- so that actually 60 percent of the world's population have had no personal experience with the murderous hydra of Nazism, the monster that wanted to strangle the globe."

Praising Mr. Wiesenthal and declaring that "we are very lucky to have Israel," Senator Jacob K. Javits asserted that Americans "must see to it that Israel is secure."

He predicted that there would be a "significant new direction" to U.S.-Israel relations in the Reagan Administration that would have a "beneficial effect" on the Middle East.

HAVAS TO GET NEGEV AWARD

"Israel's economy has made remarkable strides in three decades," Mr. Mack said in a statement, "but

even greater challenges than before confront us because of the need for providing habitable areas in the Negev for thousands of civilian and military personnel being redeployed from the Sinai."

"The reason," he said, "is that the peace treaty with Egypt mandates the return of the Sinai to Egypt within three years. The three years began in May, 1979. Israel has already begun to abandon its settlements, cities and bases established at the cost of billions of dollars, and is moving by stages into the Negev where more billions of dollars must be spent immediately to duplicate what Israel relinquished in the cause of peace."

LONDON (WNS) -- Jewish community leaders have gone on the alert following the receipt of a letter bomb by Labor MP Frank Allaun. It is feared that this could spark off a new wave of such attacks. Although the letter did not explode and although Allaun is more known for his extreme leftwing political opinions than for his connection with Jewish causes, the incident is regarded as symptomatic of a new surge in neo - Nazi anti - Semitism in Britain.

NEW YORK (WN) -- The Synagogue Council of America presented its Covenant of Peace Awards to Norman Cousins, former editor of the Saturday Review; Secretary of Commerce Philip Klutznick; singer Roberta Peters, Andrei Sakharov and Anatoly Shcharansky.

GUNMAN SHOTS B'NAI B'RITH BLOC.

WASH. (WNS) -- Police are searching for an unidentified gunman who fired nine bullets from an automatic weapon into the glass doors of the B'nai B'rith International building here and fled in a car. No one was injured. The Washington Post later received an anonymous telephone call from a man who said he was a member of the "Christian anti-Zionist League" and claimed that he had fired the shots.

Neither the police nor the B'nai B'rith had ever heard of such a group. Dr. Daniel Thurz, B'nai B'rith Executive Vice President, said that "obviously this is frightening and disturbing but we have no way of knowing whether it is the activity of one deranged person or a group."

The only eyewitness was a security guard who saw the assailant flee but could not identify him. The guard was protected by the bullet - proof glass which was only partly

penetrated by the shots.
