A mailgram meswas sent to Reagan's Washington, D.C. office signed by Jerry Falwell, presi-Moral dent of the Majority; Edward Mc-Ateer, president of the Religious Roundtable based in Arlington, and Paul Weyrich, president of the Committee for the Survival of a Free Congress, "The importance of increased understanding and action among Bible-believing Christians and for a return Jews to morality and enlightened national policies in America" was stressed by the message.

"From our religious, moral

The ultra - conservative leaders reminded Reagan that has "on many occasions publicly recognized the importance of Israel to our national security." But they expressed con-cern "Unfortunately, many of those vying for . . . positions (in foreign affairs defense) hold views which are incompatible with your policy perspective on Israel. Nevertheless, we have full confidence and trust that you will exercise good judgment regarding such critical appointments." The Moral Majority and other rightwing groups are known to be upset that Reagan is considering several prominent Republicans who served in the Nixon and Ford Administrations for key positions.

## ELECTED

LOUIS (WNS) ST. -- Kenneth Rothman, a 45 - year - old St. Louis lawyer, become the first Jew to be elected Lieutenant Governor of Missouri. Rothman, a Democrat and Speaker of the Missouri House of Represendefeated tatives, Republican , Roy Blunt by a vote of 1,050,000-792,000.

"Only in a democracy such as the United States could someone of my social, economic and ethnic background rise to a position of such stature," Rothman said. The grandson of Jewish immigrants, Rothman was born in St. Louis and educated at local schools and at Washington University where he received his law degree.

He Was first elected to the State House of Representatives in 1962 at the age of 26 and became Speaker in 1977.
