AUTONOMY DEPENDS ON REAGAN

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The future of the negotiations on autonomy for the West Bank and Gaza Strip depends on how the Reagan Administration decides to proceed. This was the assessment of sources here following three days of talks on the technical level. "We have not been negotiating matters of substance," Ezzat Abdul Latif, who headed the Egyptian group, told reporters after the meeting here.

"We have been consulting ways and means of removing the obstacles which are facing these negotiations." He said the obstacles come "from the political atmosphere that has been created either by taking decision like the Knesset decision on Jerusalem or the measures taken by the

military government in the occupied territories."

Latif called on the Israelis to help reduce tension on the West Bank, free political prisoners and allow expelled Arab leaders to return. But an Israeli source noted that it was Egypt that had suspended the talks to put pressure on Israel.

"Israel is, of course, handling the negotiations in the correct manner, with full regard to Israel's conception of the Camp David agreements, with the aim of reaching full agreement," Chaim Kubersky, who headed the Israeli negotiators, declared. "Israel will reject any attempt to go beyond the Camp David agreement or give it incorrect interpretations."

NEW WAYS TO PROCESS SOVIET JEWS

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Gaynor Jacobson, executive vice president of HIAS, has announced new procedures for processing Soviet Jewish emigrants that, if successful, might reduce the number of Soviet Jews who decide to settle in some country other than Israel. He told a press conference that under the new plan Soviet

Jewish emigrants would spend only two days in Vienna, their first stop after leaving the USSR, instead of the present eight

to ten days. Those who want to go to Israel will be flown there from Vienna.
