## HAIG SUPPORTS CAMP DAVID PACT

Gen. Haig made these statements in response to questions during the first two days of the Senate committee's hearings on his confirmation. Israeli - Arab issues were hardly mentioned as both Haig and the committee centered on Haig's views on United States policy toward the Soviet Union and his role in the Nixon Administration on Vietnam and Watergate.

However, despite the squabbling between the majority Republicans and minority Democrats over efforts to obtain tapes of converstations between Haig and President Nixon in 1973, Haig was confirmed. Haig gave the Arab-Israel conflict little mentions in his opening remarks to the committee.

Minn.), the new chairman of the com-mittee's subcommittee on the Middle East. Haig praised President Carter for his "tremendous diplomatic achievement' the Camp David accords. He said that the "Jordanian option" to bring Jordan into talks with Israel and Egypt on the Bank and Gaza Strip would be acted upon by the new Administration "in direct consultation with the various parties -- Tel Aviv and Cairo.'' No one challenged his use of Tel Aviv rather than Jerusalem.

## REPORT WALLENBERG ALIVE IN USSR PRISON

STOCKHOLM (WNS) -- Witnesses at an international hearing here on the fate of Raoul Wallenberg, the Swedish diplomat missing since helping save Hungarian Jews in 1944 - 45, reported seeing him alive in Soviet prisons.

Lipchitz, Andre stepson of the late Jacques Lipchitz, the famed Lithuanian-born Jewish sculptor said he was Wallenberg's cellmate for two days in Moscow's Lubyanka Prison shortly before Christmas 1947. The Soviet government maintains that Wallenberg died of a heart attack on July 17, 1947.

Another witness, Dr. Marvin Makinen, witness. Finnish American, said he heard about

Wallenberg in the 1960s while he was in the Vladimir Prison. Simon Wiesen-thal, the Vienna-based Nazi hunter, also told of reports of Wallenberg being alive in the USSR. The participants in the conference said they believed Wallenberg to be alive and urged the Soviet Union to receive a delegation in Moscow to discuss the matter. But the Soviet Embassy here has refused to accept the conference's resolution and would not let the conference chairman, Supreme Court Justice Ingrid Gaerde Widemar of Sweden, into the Embassy to meet with the Soviet Ambassador.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Yehezkel Mizrachi, a 29 - year - old taxi driver from Rehovot was shot to death when he took his car for repairs in a garage in the Gaza Strip. Mizrachi had just entered the shop in the Jebaliya refugee camp on the outskirts of Gaza when shots were fired at him at close range. In another incident, three members of a Jewish family from a village near Hadera were injured in a grenade attack on their car as it was passing through the Gaza Strip.
