At his press conference, Haig stressed that the Reagan Administration will follow the position of previous Administrations on Jerusalem and the Palestine Liberation Organization. On Jerusalem, Haig said that "for 30 years the U.S. has felt this is a matter that has interna-tional implications."

He said the city should "not be divided by barbed wire or imposed "unilateral restraints." In an apparent reference to the or imposed "unilateral Israeli law declaring united Jerusalem the capital of Israel, Haig said, "We don't welcome unilateral actions that make international consensus impossible.
