

CELEBRITIES ENTER DI PRO-AM

An impressive roster of 34 celebrities will be in the lineup when the \$200,000 Desert Inn National Pro-Am tees off March 19-22.

The LPGA event, presented by J&B Rare Scotch, will see Donna Caponi defend her title against former champion Nancy Lopez-Melton. Player - of - the - Year Beth Daniel, J&B Gold Putter Award winner Pat Bradley and hotshooters JoAnne Carner and Amy Alcott.

The celebrities will be led by Ole 98 and No. 7. Those may be just numbers to some, but football fans will recognize them as the jersey numbers of Tom Harmon and his son, Mark.

Tom Harmon wore Ole 98 at Michigan where he won the Heisman Trophy and All-America honors. He then went to the Los Angeles Rams where he made All - Pro.

In 1947, Tom became the first nationally known sports personality to go into broadcasting and has since worked every major sporting event on the calendar.

While winning the National Football Foundation award for all-around excellence, Mark Harmon, wearing No. 7, sparked the UCLA Bruins to two great seasons in 1972 - 73.

After leaving UCLA, Mark turned his talents to acting and has become one of the most promising superstars in television. His current assignment is the part of Fielding Carlyle, the young senator in NBC's "Flamingo Road." He has also appeared in "Centennial," "Little Mo," "The Dream Merchants," and he won an Emmy for his portrayal of a one-legged war veteran in "Eleanor and Franklin."

Six other great athletes are included among the celebrities who have committed to play in the Desert Inn National Pro-Am. They are Joe DiMaggio, Joe Garagiola, Elroy "Crazy Legs" Hirsch, Willie Mays, Alex Webster and Fred Williamson.

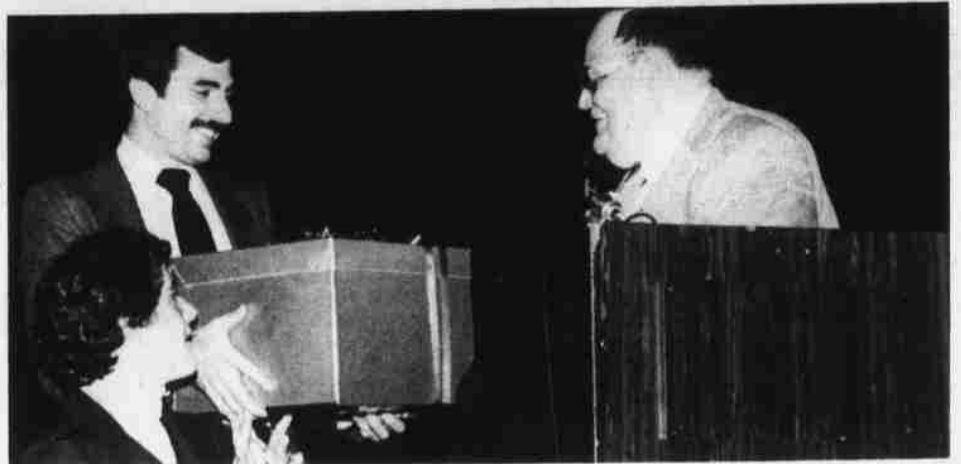
MILLION DOLLAR REWARD FOR INFO ON WALLENGER

WASH. (WNS) -- A \$1 million reward is being offered to anyone providing information leading to the tracing and freeing of Raoul Wallenberg, the Swedish diplomat who rescued Hungarian Jews from the Nazis during World War II and is believed to be in a Soviet prison. The reward offer was made by the Wallenberg Association of Stockholm and the various Free Wallenberg Committees in the United States and elsewhere. Annette Lantos co-chairperson of the Free Wallenberg Committee of the United

States, said the money has been pledged by the committees from various countries for the "great humanitarian service" which led to Wallenberg's arrest.

Mrs. Lantos and her husband, Rep. Thomas Lantos (D. Calif.), were among the thousands of Jews who owe their lives to Wallenberg. The Soviet Union has maintained that Wallenberg died of a heart attack in prison in 1947 although numerous reports indicate he is still a prisoner.
