

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The number of Jews who left the USSR in February totaled 1407, the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry reported here. The SSSJ said of these emigrants 1195 or 85 percent were dropouts and decided to go to some other country than Israel. The February figure was higher than the 850 who left in January but far below the monthly average in 1980 of 1780.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Soviet police halted an exhibition by eight Jewish artists by blocking the entrance to a private home in Moscow where the exhibition was held, it was reported here by the National Conference on Soviet Jewry. The authorities said the exhibition was "not being held in accordance with regulations." The paintings were displayed in the home of artists Sergei and Natasha Barovin, whose works were exhibited along with that of Aleksei Dimov, David and Elena Kushnirov, Mikhail Ostrovsky, Inna Strongina and Maksim Viktorov.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Federal Authorities arrested six American Nazis and supporters on charges of conspiring to blow up buildings in Greensboro, N.C., if a group of Ku Klux Klansmen and Nazis were found guilty of murdering five leftist demonstrators.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Menachem Begin sent his "deepest condolences" to President Anwar Sadat over the death of Egypt's Defense Minister Ahmed Badawi in a helicopter accident recently. Thirteen other high ranking officers perished in the mishap.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel Defense Force soldiers evacuated a group of Kiryat Arba residents from the Tomb of the Patriarchs.

BOSTON (WNS) -- Jeane Kirkpatrick, the United States Ambassador to the United Nations, has criticized the issuance of a stamp by the UN which bears the inscription "Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People." In response to a letter of protest from the Jewish Community Council of Metropolitan Boston, Kirkpatrick said: "The Reagan Administration regards the issuance of this stamp as a grave error. Given the involvement of the Palestine Liberation Organization in worldwide terrorism, we will vigorously oppose such initiatives in the future."

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The World Zionist Organization Executive has established a committee, headed by its chairman Leon Dulzin, to give a boost to the development of the Galilee. The committee will concentrate on the expansion of lookout posts, and the development of education and welfare in the area.
