Berkowitz said. "The new Administration -- which is so many areas has effectively reasserted America's national interest and defended Israel without apology at the United Nations and elsewhere -- has succumbed to the same impotence in dealing with Saudi Arabia that characterized the Carter Administration.

Berkowitz said that it is the "responsibility" of Reagan and his ad-visors "to demand, demand, that if the Saudis are to be sold F-15's and other advanced equipment they want, there must be a quid pro quo: they must cease their calls for a jihad (holy war) against Israel, cease their denuncia-President tion of (Anwar) Sadar for signing a peace treaty with Israel, cease their refusal to enter the Middle East peace process and cease financial support of the terrorist PLO to the tune of some one million dollars per day.'




