The Exodus is history's most inspiring march for freedom. Its annual celebration for more than 5,000 years as a festival commemorating the first successful struggle for the freedom of an entire people has been a beacon of hope to all peoples who seek liberty and the right to govern themselves and to determine their own national destiny.

Passover tells us that though the Jewish people had suffered the humiliation and affliction of slavery, with our exodus from bondage to salvation we achieved the glory of liberty for the Jews as free men and women in the land of Israel. We know that Israel exists more than for itself alone. It exists for all Jews everywhere as the central, unifying creative force of our future.

As Jews we know what affliction means as symbolized by the Passover matzoa -- the bread of affliction. That is why we accept the obligation to succor those in need. We are determined to aid our own through Project Renewal. For our Jewish sense of social justice widens out far beyond the limits of the Seder service. It embodies and passionately affirms the entire Jewish concept of freedom and responsibility to all who have less than their share of human dignity.

As we recite the Passover story in the Haggadah once again, we hail the fact that there is both peace between its two protagonists, Egypt and Israel, and a renewed freedom for the Egyptians and Jewish people to build an unprecedented era of peace and construction.

TALKS END ON MULTI-NATIONAL FORCE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- U.S. Deputy Assistant Secretary of State Michael Sterner ended two days of discussions here over the multi-National peace keeping force to police the Sinai after Israel withdraws next year. After having met with Egyptian leaders in Cairo before coming to Israel Sterner said "the areas of agreement are far wider than the areas of difference," between the two countries. Sterner noted that "this is the first round in which we have attempted to commit some of this to writing." He was apparently referring to an American draft that figured in the discussion here over the last two days.
