## MUST ALLOW CONGRESS TO HAVE MORE "INPUT"

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Sen. Majority Leader Howard Baker (R, Tenn.) said that President Reagan has agreed to delay submission of the Administration's proposed arms sale to Saudi Arabia until at least the fall in order to allow Congress to have some "input" into the proposal. Baker predicted that the arms proposal, when finally adopted will be "significantly different" than the package now being mentioned. Appearing on CBS-TV's "Face the Nation," Baker said the way the arms package is now being publicized, including the sale of five AWACS and enhancement equipment for the 62 F-15 jet fighters, it would have a "hard time passing Congress."

Baker said that what the consultations with Congress would try to achieve would be to make the final package "more acceptable to our friends in Israel and still acceptable to our friends in Saudi Arabia." The Senator would not say how he would vote for the present package, but said as the "President's point man" in the Senate, he would be inclined to support major Administration proposals unless it conflicted with his conscience.

Baker projected that Congress would not like the heavy pressure it is expected to undergo (Continued on Page 3)
