Begin dismissed a proposal by Josef Burg, leader of the NRP, to form a national unity government of Likud and the Labor Alignment. "These are hectic days and all sorts of suggestions are heard," Begin said. He lashed out at Labor party leader Shimon Peres who Begin said flatly rejected his own past invitations to form a national unity coalition.

Begin replied harshly when it was suggested that his new coalition might take a harder line on issues than the former Cabinet which included Ezer Weizman and Moshe Dayan. Begin said, "Moderate, extremist, empty phraseology ... My government wil! be good, efficient, compact... Government is composed of groups, they discuss matters. The majority decides. Usually it is by consensus. There is no problem of moderates or hard line. Problems are solved on their own merits.

Begin said Israel "knows everything about the joint naval maneuvers being conducted by the Soviet Union and Syria off the Syrian coast. He said they were no threat to Israel. They may be a problem for the U.S., "for the commander of the Sixth Fleet and the government that gives him orders, 'not for Israel, he said.

On the Syrian missile crisis, Begin said he would give special U.S. envoy Philip Habib more time for finding a diplomatic solution to the problem. He added however that "we can't wait forever. If they are not removed we will have to use our own means to remove them.

Begin said he thought the suspension of F-16 deliveries to Israel by the United States hurt them more than Israel. "It (the suspension) shouldn't have taken place at all." He said Israel expects to receive the six F-16's not affected by the embargo on their delivery date, July 17, and also the four embargoed planes. He reacted with anger when asked if Israel would continue to use American equipment to attack Palestinian terrorist bases in Lebanon. "We have a perfect right. It is legitimate self. It is in self - defense. This is exactly what is stated in our agreement" with the U.S., he said.
