PRIME MINISTER ROLLS UP SLEEVES AND STARTS WORK

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- President Yitzhak Navon formally called on Premier Menachem Begin to form a new government and Begin wasted no time beginning the task.

His goal is to teach agreements with the National Religious Party (NRP), the Ultra-Orthodox Aguda Israel and the new Tami faction headed by Aharon Abu - Hatzeira. Their combined total of 13 Knesset mandates added to the 48 of Likud, would give him the 61-seat

majority he needs to govern.

Begin exuded confidence predicting that his Cabinet would be ready for presentation to the new Knesset before the 21 days the Premierdesignate has to form a new government. He may request a 21 - day extension if necessary to complete the search for coalition partners.

One of the most serious pitfalls was removed when the Aguda Israel's "Council of Sages," which rules the party, indicated that it would not press Begin for an iron clad guarantee that

He would be allotted \$500 a day for gambling and other expenses while she was gone. She took the safety deposit key with her and flew to
