SAUDI ARABIA'S PEACE PLAN IS REJECTED BY ISRAELI GOV.

SADAT SAYS SAUDI PLAN "NOTHING NEW"

WASH. (WNS) -- Egyptian President Anwar Sadat appeared on NBC-TV's "Meet the Press" and declared that there was nothing new in the peace plan proposed by Saudi Arabia Crown Prince Fahd. He criticized the Saudi Ruler saying that it was "not at all" true that the Camp David peace process was a failure. Sadat urged Fahd to join in the peace process.

Sadat said that the Saudi leader had rejected the Camp David accord "even before the text" was made public. The Egyptian leader urged Saudi Arabia to

"contribute" to the peace efforts initiated by the United States, Israel and Egypt. Sadat noted that Saudi Arabia had offered recognition to Israel after the Camp David accord was signed at a conference in Baghdad. Thus, Sadat rejected claims that the recent peace proposal by Fahd was indeed the first time such an offer of recognition was initiated.

Sadat again reiterated his position of involvement of the Palestinian Liberation Organization in the peace process, a point he stressed while

CROWN PRINCE FAHD WANTS TO LIVE IN PEACE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli government officials rejected the Saudi Arabia peace plan for the Middle East conflict as "a phased program for the destruction of Israel."

Reacting just 12 hours after the plan was announced through the official Saudi News Agency, official circles in Jerusalem said, the phases of dismemberment under the Saudi plan were:

Israeli withdrawal from all the occupied areas.

Handing over the areas to the United Nations
