JERUSALEM (WNS) controversy -- The archaeological excavation in the City of David near the Western Wall between archaeologists and religious circles entered a new stage as the Chief Rabbis ruled against continuing the dig and archaeologists ignored their rulings. According to therabbis and ultra - Orthodox religious circles, the dig at the biblical city built by King Daviolated Jewish vid Law because it desecrated graves at the site. The archaeologists, headed by Prof. Yigal Shilo, maintained that no graves have been found in the four years at the site.

The controversy between the two groups has on occasion led to clashes and police have had to intervene.
