VIENNA (WNS) --Edmund Preiss, vice president of the Vienna Community Jewish charged Council Chancellor Bruno with pur-Kreisky one-sided suing a regarding policy the Middle East siand that tuation. this policy was creating a favorable climate in this counterrorists try for to attack Jews and non - Jews who are friends of Israel, it was reported here. also called Preiss for stricter measures to detect and apprehend terrorists.

Preiss emphasized that this criticism of the Chancellordoes not therefore necessarily meanthat Austrian Jews automatically support any kind of Israeli foreign policy. "As people that has suffered we can understand someone who wants his indepen-dence." Preiss said. He was apparently referring to the Palestinain campaign for 'self -- determina-tion.' Preiss also tion. called for increased surveillance of "po-tential attackers, the Arabs living in

Austria." He said surveillance had been "gravely neglected."

Meanwhile, Interior Minister Erwin Lanc said that in the near future all 4,000 Arabs have to report to their local police stations where their work permits and immigration papers will be checked, At the sume time, police said that there were no new developments in their investigation of the terrorist attack Aug. 29 on the synagogue here where two people were killed and 18 wounded.

There were however, additional anti-Semitic incidents since the attack on the Synagogue, Following the burial of one of the victims. Ulrike Kohut. hundreds of small sheets of paper with swis-. tikas printed on them were found in the alley leading to Vienna's central Jewish cemeterv.

SECURITY IS TIGHTENED IN W. GERMANY

BONN (WNS) -- Reports that a German neo - Nazi who wis trained in Palestine Liberation Organization camps in 1 ebanon is suspected of complicity in the murder last May of Vienna city councilm in Heinz Nittel, president of the Austrian - Israel Society. Friendship has resulted in tightening of security around Jewish instifutions in this country, according to a report here.

security official said that a full scale investigation is going on to determine whether there is any possible plot against Jewish personalities or friends of Israel in West Germany. The official said that about 10 neo-Nazis who were trained in PLO camps are known to be presently in Germany. He could not say how many other German neo - Nazis are still training in Lebanon.
