BEGIN HAS FAVORABLE 10-DAY VISIT WITH AMERICAN LEADERS

NO LINKAGE ON AWACS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Menachem Begin vehemently denied that there was any linkage between the strategic cooperation agreement with the U.S., reached during his visit to Washington, and the way Congress will dispose of the Administration's proposed sale of AWACS radar planes to Saudi Arabia.

He said that during his meetings with President Reagan and other Administration officials, there was never a hint that the U.S. linked the AWACS sale to strategic cooperation with Israel. Begin, along with Defense Minister Ariel Sharon and Interior Minister Yosef Burg, who were with him in Washington, briefed reporters after the Cabinet meeting.

The Cabinet was formally notified that there was an agreement in principle between Israel and the U.S. on strategic - security cooperation and expressed Israel's unreserved opposition to the sale of offensive arms to the Saudis, which includes the AWACS radar planes.

Begin has already come under strong attack from the Labor Alignment and other opposition factions over the strategic cooperation agreement and for allegedly modifying Israel's objections to the AWACS sale in exchange for the agreement. A Knesset debate is likely, although no party has yet moved to initiate one. The government however is reportedly searching through the archives to gather material to show that Israel had long sought to cooperate with the U.S. against the perceived threat of communism in the region.

SALE OF AWACS IS BIGGEST TOPIC

NEW YORK (WNS) Premier Menachem Begin ended his 10 - day visit to the U.S. in a series of meetings with American Jewish leaders, Black American leaders and a quick stop at Plains, Ga., to visit former President Carter. But in Washington there remained a continual rift both official and unofficial, as to the status of the strategic cooperation agreement Begin reached with President Reagan and just whether that new cooperation agreement would be dependent upon Congressional approval of the Administration's proposal to sell AWACS reconnaissance planes to Saudi Arabia.

Before leaving to Israel, Begin met at his

"God giveth and God taketh away" is not for the layman to dwell upon. The mysticism surrounding life and death is more for the rabbis and scholars to ponder over. My presence here is not even intended as eulogy since the family of Larry Snow has already gone through the rigors of a rigid orthodox service back east. As the Rabbi has said, this is not a memorial service but rather a tribute to a man we all very much loved and respected.

As Larry's oldest friend, I can only add to this tribute by in a small way portraying the man I learned to love and admire as a dear friend, and saw as a devoted husband, totally concerned father and grandfather, and in the closing days of his life, great grandfather, too.

I met Larry Snow in the early 40's back East. We were both engaged in a business which did not have the respectability it now enjoys. It remained, for this great state -- the State of Nevada, to remove the hypocrisy surrounding our industry.

I was younger and naive. Larry was already worldly, wise and knowledgeable. I was withdrawn, he was the extrovert. It was he who took me in hand and guided me through the ups and downs of our livelihood and became not only my mentor, but the very essence of my survival. We became fast friends and that friendship continued to grow stronger and stronger until those very last days.

If there was one predominant factor in his life, it was that the family and its preservation was of most importance. With a passion that
