"PEACE FOREVER" WITH ISRAEL

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Menachem Begin returned from Egyptian President Anwar Sadar's funeral Oct. 10 in Cairo "strengthened in his hope that the peace process would continue under Hosni Mubarak, Egyptian Vice-President and Sadat's successor, Cabinet Secretary Arye Naor said after the weekly Cabinet meeting here.

Begin reported to the Ministers on his mission to the Sadat funeral, together with Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir and Interior Minister Yosef Burg. Deputy Premier Simcha Ehrlich, in a radio interview after the meeting, said there was no doubt among the Ministers that Israel must continue with its part in the peace process "as energetically, or even more energetically," than

PETS AND ELDERLY, I have, on occasion, expressed the hope that in my next reincarnation I will be a small brown French poodle owned by a suburban Jewish family. As an animal lover (dogs in particular), I regard that as the highest form of existence, replete with love and care. Therefore, I was fas-cinated by an article by Patricia Curris in the July 1981 issue of Smithsonian Magazine describing developments in new ways, beyond aiding the blind and deaf, of using animals to help people who need the special qualities which pets have to offer.

Ms. Curtis speaks of pets as "companion animals" thereby conferring upon them (perhaps this was not her intention) a status of requality, as it were, with humans rather than of inferiority which the term ret implies. Lest you think that I have gone meshuga (or to the dogs), he advised that according to Ms. Curtis, "The bond between people and their pets is now the subject of respectable scientific scrutiny." She describes research programs and projects in "pet - facilitated psychotherapy" being conducted under university auspices in psychiatric hospitals and homes for the aged to reach withdrawn, depressed and even senile persons. Further, she states that "recent research suggests to medical and social scientists that companion animals may be good for all of us even perhaps therapeutic in ways we are only

beginning to discover.

Significant research on the bond between human beings and companion animals is being conducted at the Center for the Interaction of
