

BEGIN CONFIDENT PEACE WILL

raeli delegation from Cairo, Begin said that he found "a strong government in Egypt... A government which keeps control." Begin cited with approval Mubarak's declaration to Israeli reporters that Sadat's peace policy would remain unchanged.

Begin met with Mubarak and said there had been "a very simple, very dramatic moment; we shook hands and both pledged 'peace forever.' Of course we are both only mortals. What we meant was that our children and grandchildren should have peace." Begin said there was no cause for concern that Egypt might be unstable in the wake of Sadat's killing. He found Cairo "quiet, with no indication of any disorder. They have the country under control."

Meanwhile, Israeli officials moved quickly to squelch press speculation that Israel might advance its final withdrawal from Sinai as a "gesture" to the new Egyptian government. Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir said the speculation was entirely groundless. The time left til April 1982, the deadline for Israeli withdrawal from the Sinai, was short enough, Shamir said, adding that Israel had no reason to make it shorter.

In a related item, President Yitzhak Navon said peaceful relations between Israel and Egypt cannot be reversed. Navon said during a visit to the Bedouin town of Rahat in the Negev that Mubarak and other Egyptian leaders would continue to implement the peace agreement as planned.

Navon said he did not share the view that Mubarak was an enigma. He said that when he met with Mubarak last year in Egypt he asked him directly what he thought about peace with Israel, and why he was not heard from more on this issue. Mubarak explained Navon said, that he had previously refrained from making statements on the peace process because he was Deputy President, and it was up to the President to make statements. Navon said he was impressed that Mubarak stuck to the peace process between the two countries.

HAIG WANTS HALT ON WEST BANK

WASH. (WNS) -- Secretary of State Alexander Haig said in an interview from Cairo where he was part of the American delegation to Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's funeral that Israel should not increase settlements on the West Bank while the autonomy ne-

gotiations with Egypt are in progress.

Haig said he was assured by both President elect Hosni Mubarak and Israeli Premier Menachem Begin that the autonomy negotiations will continue and will be resumed soon. "We would hope that during this process there

would not be a further enlargement of the West Bank settlements and we made it clear," Haig said in a television interview on NBC-TV's "Meet the Press" program.

Meanwhile, on CBS-TV's "Face the Nation" program, Richard Allen, President Reagan's National Security Advisor said

the Administration does not consider the West Bank settlements to be "helpful." He added that the Administration continued not to have any comment on their legality. Both Haig and Allen stressed that the most important outcome following Sadat's assassination Oct. 6 is that Mubarak and Begin pledged to continue the autonomy talks.

Haig said he told Begin and Mubarak in Cairo that there was no need to "strip aside certain inflexibilities of the past" in order to reach the settlement on autonomy for the Palestinians of the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. He indicated that both leaders agreed.

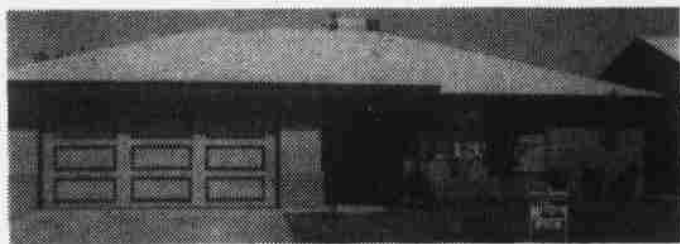
