

SADAT PRAISED AROUND THE WORLD

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The assassination of President Anwar Sadat of Egypt Oct. 6, gunned down by a group of Egyptian soldiers as he watched a military parade in Nasser City, has sent shockwaves through the Mideast and mounting speculation both here and in Washington as to the status of the Mideast peace process.

Immediately following the announcement of Sadat's death, international community leaders expressed their shock and grief. Inevitably, concern focused on what effect Sadat's death would have on the Israeli - Egyptian peace process.

Premier Menachem Begin said: "We hope that the peace process despite the cruel act of its enemies will continue as we know President Sadat would wish with all his heart." The Premier, who made his statement to reporters, said in a low voice filled with emotion that Sadat had fallen "victim to a criminal assassination. President Sadat was murdered by the enemies of peace. I therefore lost today, together with the people of Israel, not only a partner in the peace process but a friend." Begin referred to Sadat's historic visit to Jerusalem in November, 1977, which initiated the peace

process as "one of the great events of our times." The Egyptian, he declared, had paid no need to the abuse heaped upon him as he walked "the difficult road to peace" with Begin and President Carter at Camp David.

In Washington, President Reagan praised Sadat as a "humanitarian unafraid to make peace" and said that the American people were "horrified" by the cowardly murder of the Egyptian President. "America has lost a close friend, the world has lost a great statesman, mankind has lost a champion of peace," Reagan declared in a national televised appearance.

Ambassador Ashraf Fhorbal of Egypt appeared in front of the Embassy to declare that Egypt would continue to follow in Sadat's path under the leadership of Egyptian Vice President Hosni Mubarak. Ghorbal added that Egypt would fulfill "its international obligations" and will continue to involve itself in the camp David peace process working in close relationship with the U.S.

Even before Sadat's death was confirmed, Israeli groups opposed to the peace treaty with Egypt demanded that the government immediately suspend all preparations for Israel's final withdrawal from Sinai, scheduled for April 1, 1982. Prof. Yuval Ne'eman, leader of the ultra - na-

tionalist Tehiya faction, claimed that the attack on Sadat proved that the Middle East was "not ripe for peace" and called on the government to cease the withdrawal process. Yitzhak Regev, chairman of the settlers council in Yamit in northern Sinai, made a similar demand. Political observers here believe Sadat's assassination will strengthen the long simmering movement to stop the withdrawal from Sinai, one of the key requirements of the peace treaty.
