of his assassination on the very anniversary of that sneak attack -- this year two days before Yom Kippur.

It is interesting to note that, although we mourn the passing of Sadat, this dramatic act took place while a military parade in celebration of the 'victory' of the Egyptian Army in the Yom Kippur was at its height!

Let the record be straight. Sadat's 'peace' with Israel, as he had originally enunciated it in the Knesset in 1977, had remained unchanged. The PLO must be recognized; a Palestinian State in Samaria and Judea must arise, and East Jerusalem must come under Arab sovereignty.

Less than a week before the assassination, a UPI dispatch from Cairo reported that President Sadat's National Democratic Party had urged the Palestinians to establish a government-in-exile and during a three-day conference of the party, the Foreign Relations Committee had approved resolutions that included an affirmation of the right of the Palestinians to self-determination and the establishment of their own state: a call for mutual recognition by Israel and the Palestinians, and for the establishment of a Palestinian government-in-exile as a step toward a Palestinian State, and a recommendation that East Jerusalem be restored to Arab sovereignty.

This was Sadat's adamant position and this, no doubt, is what he would have demanded of Israel after April 1982 when the Israelis, according to Camp David were scheduled to withdraw from all of Sinai.

Now the question of withdrawal raises questions. The assassination has raised many questions among officials in Washington. For example, one of these is: "Will Israel continue to deal with the new Egyptian leadership on the same terms as it did with Sadat? Even under the best of circumstances," some officials hold, "the chances of Israel to make major concessions in the autonomy talks to Mr. Sadat were slim." They noted that Begin will find himself under pressure from Israelis living in the part of Sinai under Israeli control not to give up the territory next April because of the uncertainty of the Egyptian leadership's policies after it retrieves the last segment of Sinai.

Anwar el-Sadat's passing this Yom Kippur season 5742 marks the end of an era and the beginning of a new day for both the United States and Israel as Washington and Jerusalem, more particularly, Washington, will begin to realize that close liaison between the two nations is vital for the security of both. The alliance which Reagan and Begin forged must now take on a new meaning. Indeed, both Israel and the U.S., need each other more than ever as allies.

JILL ROTH BECOMES BAT MITZVAH

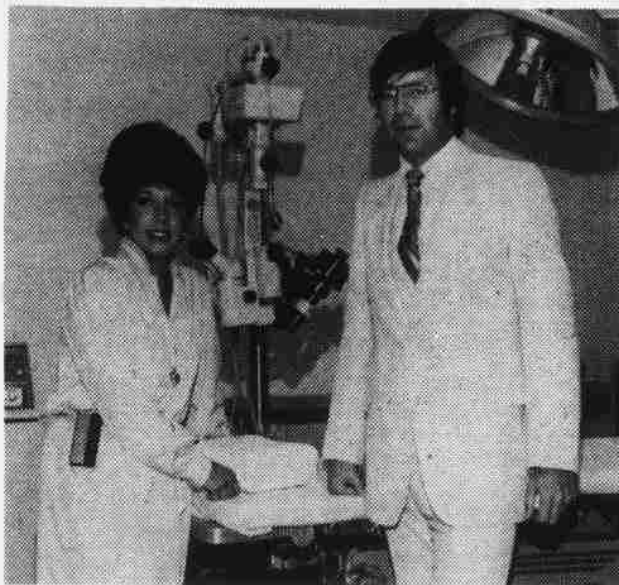

WALLENBERG GRANTED CITIZENSHIP

WASH. (WNS) -- Raoul Wallenberg, the Swedish diplomat businessman, who is credited with saving the lives of 100,000 Hungarian Jews in World War II, was conferred honorary citizenship by President Reagan at a ceremony at the White House. Wallenberg is only the second person to be granted such an honor. Noting that Wallenberg is speculated to be still alive in a Soviet prison, Reagan declared, "Wherever he is, his humanity burns like a torch."

Reagan said Wallenberg exemplified compassion and that the U.S. has asked Sweden in 1944 to concentrate protecting Hungarian Jews who faced extermination at the hands of the Nazis. "The United States supplied the funds and the directives, and Raoul Wallenberg supplied the courage and the passion," the President said. Re-

gan said that Wallenberg's seizure by Russian troops in 1945 at the end of the war was "in violation of diplomatic immunity and international law."

He was referring to the fact that the Swedish government gave Wallenberg diplomatic status in 1944 and assigned him to Budapest where he issued Swedish passports and pressed Hungarian authorities to improve the treatment of Jews and Roman Catholics.

RUSSIAN JEWS SHOULD CHOOSE ISRAEL

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Although Russian Jews should choose Israel as their destination for emigration to avoid the "relentless forces of assimilation" awaiting them in other countries, nevertheless the new Jewish Agency policy to halt assistance to those heading for the Diaspora is "coercion, an approach totally foreign to Jewish tradition."

This charge was made in a statement released by the chairmen of the Agudath Israel World Organization, Rabbi Moshe Sherer of New York and Rabbi Yehuda Abramowitz of Jerusalem. The Agudath leaders stated that "there is no guarantee that Jews forced to settle in Is-

rael will remain there.

The statement by the leaders of the Agudath Israel World Organization reads: "the Agudath Israel World Organization views with deep concern and regret that a large number of Jews now leaving Russia -- Jews who have lived their entire lives in a society marked by inexorable forces of assimilation -- are deciding, after their many years of spiritual exile, not to settle in Israel."

"Undoubtedly, the prospects for them to live a Jewish life are greater in Israel than in other countries, where they will continue to be subjected to the relentless forces of assimilation and total alienation from Judaism
