SINATRA HEADS SCOPUS AWARD



Frank Sinatra and Milton A. Rudin will serve as general chairmen of the 12th annual Scopus Award Gala of the American Friends of the Hebrew University in tribute to Nancy Reagan Sunday evening, November 15, at the Beverly Hilton Hotel.

This is the third consecutive year that Rudin, president of the Western States Region of the American Friends, has chaired the Scopus dinner. He is an Honorary Fellow of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and a member of its Society of the Founders. He is a member of the law firm of Rudin, Perlstein Chieffo.

For Sinatra, the Nancy Reagan evening marks the seventh year in which he has been associated with the Scopus Awards. He presented the award, highest honor that the Friends can bestow, on maestro Artur Rubinstein in 1975, on John Wayne and Nobel Laureates Milton Friedman and Dr. Baruch S. Blumberg in 1977, on Gregory Peck and Dinah Shore in 1978, and on Harvey I., Silbert in 1979. He received the Scopus Award in 1976.
