

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The government will spend more than 800 million Shekels on Project Renewal this year including 42 million for new apartments, 30 million to evacuate families from flats no longer fit to live in; 80 million for loans and expansion of housing; 610 million for renovations and infrastructure; and the rest for rental housing, according to details of the budget contained in a report prepared by David Levy, Deputy Premier and Construction Minister.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Eilat's week-long celebration to mark the opening of its winter tourist season got off to a damp start. The normally dry resort town in the eastern extremity of the Red Sea was busy cleaning up and repairing damage caused by a sudden cloudburst which dumped an inch of rain in one hour on Oct. 30. As a result, hotels operated at only half of capacity.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Over \$3 million worth of hashish has been washed ashore on an Israeli beach. Police helicopters and jeeps scoured the beaches all along Israel's coastal plain to see if other quantities may have drifted ashore.

BONN (WNS) -- Four neo-Nazi aged 22-24 have been sentenced by a Karlsruhe court to jail terms on between seven and 16 months it was reported here. They were found guilty of instigation, stock piling of neo-Nazi propaganda material as well as inflicting damage to property.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Charlotte Jacobson, Chairman of the Soviet Jewry Research Bureau of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry reported that only 368 Soviet Jews arrived in Vienna in October, the lowest monthly emigration figure recorded. This number represents a drop from the previous low of 405 Jews who left the Soviet Union in September. Of the October arrivals, in Vienna, 89 continued on to Israel and 279 opted to settle in Western countries.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The staircase at the Isaiah Peace Wall opposite the United Nations was designated the "Shcharansky Steps" in honor of the Soviet Jewish Prisoner of Conscience Anatoly Shcharansky. The dedication, headed by Mayor Edward Koch, was sponsored by the Greater New York Conference on Soviet Jewry, with the Office of the Mayor and the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A proposal to open future Knesset sessions with the recitation of a psalm was overwhelmingly approved. Members of the opposition Labor Party joined Likud MKs to endorse the innovation. They cited the example of the British House of Commons, on which much Knesset procedure is modeled, which begins each day with a prayer.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli military and civilian authorities were reportedly pleased when Maj. Saad Haddad rescinded his resignation as commander of the Christian militia in south Lebanon only 48 hours after he announced it over the "Voice of Hope" Christian radio station.
