

EL AL MAY STRIKE AGAIN

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Cabinet issued a moderately worded statement on the strike - grounded El Al airline in an apparent effort to keep the door open for a quiet solution of the airline's latest labor crisis, but the strike continued.

Contrary to expectations, there was no mention in the Cabinet statement about a possible shutting down of the airline. The issue reportedly was raised during the Cabinet session but some Ministers expressed strong opposition to the idea of dissolving El Al. The Cabinet asked the El Al workers to return to work immediately adding that the controversy over the dismissal of 18 flight engineers should be settled by negotiation under the union contract, or submitted to arbitration.

The El Al management meanwhile announced it would pay no salaries to the strikers and would not enter negotiations until the strikers returned to work. But both management and the worker committees indicated some satisfaction with the

Cabinet position. The management regarded the Cabinet resolution and public support for the call to return to work by Transportation Minister Haim Corfu, as backing management's firm stand against the strike. The workers noted the moderate tone of the Cabinet resolution and the government's apparent decision to stay out of any talks about the airlines dissolution.

ISRAEL SILENT ON OVERFLIGHTS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- An announcement from Riyadh that Saudi Arabian fighters had to "chase" Israeli Air Force jets out of Saudi territory elicited a terse "no comment" from its Defense Ministry.

The Ministry vehemently denied however, reports that Israeli planes had attacked targets in Saudi Arabia. The "no comment" stance on the overflights and the denial that targets were attacked indi-

cated to observers here that the overflight apparently for photo reconnaissance purposes had indeed taken place and that they probably have been going on for some time.

According to observers, they were intended as a warning to the Saudis, who, Defense Minister Ariel Sharon said are now considered as a "confrontation" state because of the advanced weaponry it will be receiving from the U.S., including AWACS radar planes.
