SOVIET JEWS ARE HOSTAGE

WASH. (WNS) --Soviet Jews in the Union, whose situation can be called "drastic" are "being held hostage" pending an improve-"cool" ment of the relations between the U.S. and the USSR, Theodore Mann, chairman of the National Conference for Soviet Jewry (NCSJ) said at a luncheon with reporters at the NCSJ office. He said he expected the condition of Soviet Jews, which was described as in an "emergency situation, would get worse in the next few months before it, hopefully improved in 1982. 
