Bankshares is the holding company for the Bank of Commerce in New York City and Community State Bank in Albany, as well as 10 other Virginia banks in Maryland, Tennessee and the District of Columbia. The consortium made a bid for the holding company. Ohrenstein, who for the past eight months has spear-

drive to deny the representatives of the Arab countries their bid, called the vote a victory for New York State. He said "the integrity of New York State banking system has been upheld. The policies of these countries could have at times been hostile to the interests of the United States. I think this was a pivotal fact in denying the application, although the main reason given tempted. was a lack of reciprocity which I have stressed for the last eight months."
