

FEW SOVIET JEWS EMIGRATE

NEW YORK (WNS) -- "A devastatingly low number of Soviet Jews -- only 363 -- were permitted to leave the Soviet Union during the month of November" reported Charlotte Jacobson, chairman of the Soviet Jewry Research Bureau of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry.

"This drastic shrinking in the number of emigration visas granted further validates the sharp change in Soviet attitude toward Jews and leave the Soviet minority virtually helpless against the authorities' campaign to virtually halt all emigration from the USSR.

This would leave hundreds of thousands of Jews locked into a country which is increasingly hostile to them as Jews' Jacobson declared. The November figure fell

below October's all-time low of 368 and is expected to decrease further by the year's end.

Meanwhile, in Albany, N.Y., State Assemblyman Richard Gottfried (D-L, Manhattan) reported that Boris Chernobilsky a Soviet Jew who successfully eluded Russian authorities for four months was arrested in Moscow on Thanksgiving Day. Chernobilsky went underground in late July on the eve of his scheduled trial before a Moscow court. He had been charged with "resisting a representative of authority" when Soviet police broke up a gathering of Jews in a forest outside Moscow in May. Chernobilsky his wife, and two young daughters have been refused an exit visa since 1975 on grounds of "state secrecy."

diplomats (consuls) and no longer by Jewish Agency emissaries it was reported.

Leon Dulzin, WZO-Jewish Agency chairman, immediately attacked the proposal and branded it as "anti-Zionist." Dulzin said it had been raised in the past, but it ignored the special status of the WZO in Jewish affairs.

In media interviews Waldman said this would be the normal and natural situation.
